

STRONGHOLD OF ALMEIDA

Almeida is an impressive modern fortified square, in other words, bulwarked. It has six strongholds, six ravelins, a covered terrace, two double gates and three posterns. In the 18th century, this was the kingdom's most advanced defence effort. Nowadays, it deserves a visit alongside Teodoro, a ghost that was born, vanished, and returned to this great plateau. This shape created the name Al-Mêda (the Table).





GHOST GUIDE: TEODORO ABOIM

Heads up! We recommend going across the «Pai in o Azar» and the bomb-proof roofs of the casemator. Ask your guide to tell you about the "roda dos explains". If you're good at flying, go to the most beautiful spots on the Coa River, where the French and Anglo-Portuguese armies clashed.

CASTLE OF MARVÃO

Marvão is a natural heritage that man adapted to his defensive needs. The fortress was created to welcome lock, stock and barrel soldiers and only then people without war in their suitcases, like our guide's family, the Baluartes. Do not hesitate to ask him questions about sweets, including the chestnut pastel. During the restoration war (seventeenth century), the fortress of Marvão was «car > » as we know it today, unchanged since then.





CHOST CUIDE: ACÚRSIO BALUARTE BARRABÁS

Keen eye! Are you good at finding invaders? And traitors? Discover the sally port, the small cistern and the medieval toilet. Are you good at hiking? Then find the smuggler's route outside the walls.

FORT OF ELVAS

The Dutch Cosmander crosses the garrison town of Elvas and the surrounding fortifications, showing why the largest bulwarked dry-ditch system became a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The visit includes the bulwalk wall of the historic centre, the Fort of Santa Luzia, the Fort of Graça, the Fortlets of São Domingos, São Pedro and São Mamede and the Aqueduct of Amoreira.





GHOST GUIDE: PASCACIO COSMANDER

Keen eye! Stop by the Military Museum to learn about the typical elements of the bulwarked buildings. Head to the Governor's House (on top of Fort of Graça). Say "he to the portraits of the Count of Lippe and the engineer Valleré, authors of the project. Don't forget to taste the plums from Elvas.

STRONGHOLD OF VALENÇA

From the top of the hill of the pentagonal fortress of Valença, you can see the border, the river Minho and the Spanish city of Tui. Our guide Maruja will show you a true showcase of military engineering solutions (bulwarks, ravelins, barbicans, gates, redans, tencilles, magazines and casemates). Let's not forget the "Portas do Meic" ne backdrop of a love story beyond walls, borders and the world of the living.



CHOST GUIDE: MARUJA ALBUKREK



Keen eye! Go to the chapel of Bom Jesus and check out the medals of Nossa Senhora do Carmo, a statue worn in a backpack, from battle to battle, for good luck. Cross the bastion of Carmo and observe the cannon at hand. How many cannons do you count in total? If you have time, make your way to Tui and watch Portugal with other "ojos" = res).
